Founded in 1911, the New Zealand Olympic Committee (NZOC) has a unique mandate to select and lead The New Zealand Team to Olympic and Commonwealth Games across the globe.

At the heart of our organisation are our athletes and teams. Their stories shape our national identity, and through their achievements, they represent Aotearoa New Zealand with honour and pride. Bound by the ponga – the silver fern, the enduring symbol of New Zealand sport, Te Kapa o Aotearoa - the New Zealand Team showcases our unique culture and values on the world stage.

For over a century, New Zealand athletes have worn the silver fern with distinction. In 1978, the fern was officially integrated with the Olympic rings, debuting on the team uniform at the 1980 Moscow Games as the 'rings and fern' symbol. Today, this emblem remains an iconic representation of Te Kapa o Aotearoa - the New Zealand Team.

As a charitable organisation, we rely on commercial and philanthropic partnerships to promote sport, uphold Olympic values, and drive success on the global stage. With support from Olympic Solidarity we deliver education programmes to inspire young New Zealanders and help fund athlete and sport development across the country.

Our collaboration with High Performance Sport New Zealand and Sport New Zealand – Ihi Aotearoa plays a crucial role in supporting athlete performance.

Te Whare o Pou Tangata is a unique Māori model that depicts Who We Are as the New Zealand Olympic Committee. The exterior represents our core values while internally, key structures integral to sustaining our whare are aligned to our strategy.
